



# Make your own butterfly mask

The Avon Gorge and Downs are one of the most exciting places to enjoy wildlife in Bristol, and they're only two miles from the city centre!

Why not have a go at making a **butterfly** mask?



## Instructions:

- 1) Decorate the mask on by either colouring it in or, for a more exciting effect, why not try sticking bits of shiny, sparkly or furry material on it? The more colours and textures the better!
- 2) Cut around the mask. You may need an adult to help you with this as it is quite tricky!
- 3) Cut out the eyes in the centre of the mask. This bit is super tricky so remember to ask an adult for help if you need it.
- 4) Staple or stick a piece of elastic to each side of the mask. If you use staples, you will need to cover it with a bit of sticky tape to stop it from scratching your skin when you put it on.
