



Make your own gorgeous goat mask

The Avon Gorge and Downs are one of the most exciting places to enjoy wildlife in Bristol, and they're only two miles from the city centre!

Why not have a go at making your own Avon Gorge **goat** mask?



Instructions:

- 1) Decorate the mask. You can either make a realistic goat by sticking on white furry material or, for a more exciting effect, why not colour it in or stick on bits of shiny, sparkly material? The more colours and textures the better!
- 2) Cut around the mask. You may need an adult to help you with this as it is quite tricky!
- 3) Cut out the eyes in the centre of the mask. This bit is super tricky so remember to ask an adult for help if you need it.
- 4) Staple or stick a piece of elastic to each side of the mask. If you use staples, you will need to cover up the sharp staple ends with a bit of sticky tape to stop them from scratching your skin when you put it on.
